Martin E. Gordon, M.D., Clinical Professor of Medicine, Yale School of Medicine, had been a Consulting Gastroenterologist to the Department of Yale University Health Services and many Conn.-based hospitals while in Private Practice during which time he received the American College of Physician's Laureate Award for patient care. The Yale New Haven Medical Residents also honored him by the Benedict Harris Teaching Award for contributing most to their First Year of Resident training.

He created and instigated the annual International Digestive Disease Week "**Learning Center**". Its ongoing format now attracts approximately 14,000 specialists/visitors annually. Dr. Gordon has produced national and international medical teaching films, exhibits, and various medical teaching devices, including the "**Global Disease Guide**", an aid in disease prevention and post-travel diagnosis, used internationally as a desk reference for healthcare workers.

While Clinical Professor of Medicine, interactions with students, House Officers & faculty at Yale Medical Center remains ongoing, e.g. he has initiated and is coordinating integration of Yale Medical Students as Tour Guides/Mentors with high school students with the Connecticut State "**BIO-BUS**" program to further stimulate youth interest in the bio-medical sciences. Similarly, is his role as Finalist Judge in the National FIRST Robotic Competitions to further encourage future Engineering/ Science careers.

He instigated the Digital Imaging Center within the Cushing/Whitney Med. Library, featuring Award-winning Int'l Science Films, now freely available for students, faculty and visitors to aid in their comprehensive enrichment for themselves and others. He has been a long-standing member of the Dean's International Health Committee and the Wilbur Down's International Fellowship Program and received Yale University Wilbur G. Downs International Health Fellowship **Honoris Causa** in recognition for "Outstanding Service and Abiding Support of the Downs Student Travel Fellows" on April 16, 2008.

His publications appeared in the New England Journal of Medicine, Science, The Lancet, Am. Journal of Gastroenterology, Gastrointestinal Endoscopy and Wilderness & Environmental Medicine. Representative CD-ROM Reviews were published in JAMA, NEJM. Amer. J. Gastroenterology. He has worked in close association with governmental sections such as AFIP, CDC & various pharmaceutical corporations. The New England Journal of Medicine has published his Book Reviews on the texts *Travel Medicine* and thereafter, *Malpractice Myths* (April 20, 2006). He was a Consultant/Reviewer for the Conn. State Med. Insurance Corporation & others, all recognizing him as an Expert in appropriate medical/legal matters. He **now is listed as an Expert Witness in National Directories** of Experts.com, SEAK. TASA and others.

Diverse Awards have included the AMWA Will Solimine Award for "Excellence in Med. Communication"; the International "Freddie Award" Statute, recognizing his ongoing contributions as Annual Dean of Finalist Judges; Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, cited for "...contributions to clinical gastroenterology, travel medicine and biomedical film productions". He was the Designated Recipient for the Yale School of Medicine Distinguished Alumni Service Award in June, 2000 and has received the coveted 2004 Dean's Peter Parker Medal "for lifetime contributions to medicine and the well-being of Yale School of Medicine".

As reelected Chairman, Board of Trustees, Cushing/Whitney Medical Associates for 10 years, he was made Honorary Lifetime Trustee in 2008, in recognition of his initiating Annual Keynote speakers ranging from NASA Director, Daniel Golden; Surg. Gen'l David Satcher; Nobel Laureates Joshua Lederberg and Peter Agre; Genomic pioneers, Douglas Melton and J. Craig Venter; Inventor Dean Kamen; Lancet Editor, Richard Horton; Robert Weinberg. MIT Cancer Researcher; Harvey Feinberg, President of Institute of Medicine; Library of Congress Director, James Billington, to name a few. He created & produced all interactive Exhibits with DVD's\* for each annual meeting. These streamed presentations included "Microscopy, Tools of the Biomedical Sciences" which received Int'l recognition, thereafter distributed to medical schools and major research laboratories. A special Exhibit," All Available Boats", while chairing a distinguished Symposium Panel on "Disaster Alert--Be Ready , became available" to the public and school children This production travelled extensively after 9/11 (co-sponsored by Pfizer Int'l & Yale University).\*\*

His current activities, based in St. Louis, Missouri, include the authored DVD production of "**Medical Innovations- From Obsidian Scalpels to Nano Particles**"(partially edited and narrated in the studios of Public TV, KETC).
